### 1. Welcome, attendance and apologies:

4. <u>2024-25 Schools Forum Report EYFF – Deborah Allcorn and Clare Hassell:</u>
DA and CH referred to their previously shared report, noting several key areas of attention.

## **Introduction:**

A new Early Years Funding formula is being introduced for children aged two and nine months to two years. This formula will calculate the hourly funded rate providers will receive. Existing arrangements for the Early Years Funding are being revised following consultation with providers, and Schools forum members are requested to consider the proposed changes.

# Background information for funding:

The current two-year-old hourly rate is a flat rate for all providers and is available for eligible children of families receiving some additional forms of government support. With the introduction of the new entitlements for working families, Local Authorities must extend Special Educational Needs Inclusion Funds (SENIF) for all children with special educational needs and have deprivation supplement arrangements for the disadvantaged two-year-old entitlement and the new working parent entitlements.

Early Years provider's funding comprises a basic hourly rate and supplements known as the Early Years Funding Formula (EYFF). Currently, the supplements consist of:

- A payment for a leadership qualification
- A quality payment if the setting has achieved an Ofsted Inspection grading of Good or Outstanding.
- An additional supplement for the deprivation score for the setting, which is calculated
  using the income deprivation affecting children index or the IDACI score of where the
  children are from attending the setting.
- A teacher's pay and pension grant for qualified teachers employed in maintained schools and academies.

# Change of process:

It was explained that the two-year-old funding has historically been paid to providers using a flat rate with no access to special educational needs inclusion funds. From 2024-25, the Government is introducing funding for children of working families aged two years and under, and the funding rates should consist of a base rate, supplements, and contingency funding. It is proposed that the EYFF will be introduced for the two-year-olds and 9-month-to-two-year-old rates. The funding rate will consist of a base rate and supplements for additional needs, leadership, and quality.

The consultation asks providers for comments on the following:

The Schools forum noted the introduction of a funding formula for children aged two years and under aligns with the current three and four-year-old funding formula.

# **Financial Calculations:**

It was stated if the 2023-24 existing local Early Years Funding Formula is used to calculate the two-year-old hourly rate, the average provider hourly rate will increase by 11p per hour from  $\pounds 7.30$  to  $\pounds 7.41$  per hour. The new average provider hourly rate for children aged 9 months to two years will be  $\pounds 9.97$ .

## Consultation response:

The consultation closed on 05th February 2024, and comments were requested via an electronic survey form that went out to all providers.

The Schools forum members noted very few comments were received, with 21 settings responding. The answers to some of the comments made were within the actual consultation document sent. The Schools forum was supplied with example responses from some childminders, day nurseries, preschools, and the Local Authority replies.

Q – Does this only affect 2-year-olds and younger and not 3-year-olds in nursery?

A - No, it does not affect them. It just aligns the two-year-olds with the current three-year forum, which is centrally distributed.

The Schools Forum members considered and voted on the following points:

Decision - The Schools' forum voted and agreed to accept the proposed changes to the existing arrangements of the Early Years Funding Formula to include children aged two and children aged nine months to two years.

Decision – The Schools' forum voted and agreed to accept the proposed increase to the provider hour rates by 11p per hour from £7.30 to £7.41 per hour for 2-year-olds. The new average provider hourly rate for children aged 9 months to two years will be £9.97.
